Online ticket price: \$15.00 (includes booking fee) for all patrons aged 5 years and over. Children under 5 free with paying adult. **Family bundle** available with discounted Child tickets.

For patrons unable to book online, tickets will be sold at the Showground Office on **Sunday 14 April 2024** from 10am until 2pm.

Pre-purchase to avoid disappointment. Don't forget to keep your ticket(s) secure until Show day. Tickets are valid for both Friday and Saturday of the Show and include Showground parking (until carpark is full).

Gate ticket price at the Show: \$20 for all patrons aged 5 years and over. Children under 5 free with paying adult.

Showground Conditions of Entry

- All patrons, members, exhibitors, judges, and guests must scan ticket at main gate.
- No glass or alcohol is permitted to be brought onto the grounds.

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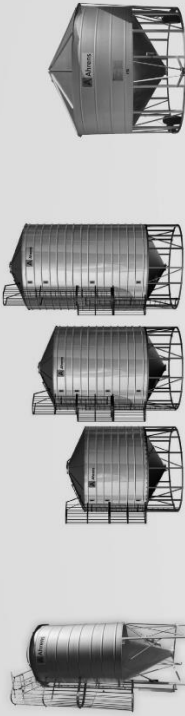

The rain cancelled many of the entries in the sheep and cattle sections, although the poultry and main pavilions were well supported. The lawn mower racing went ahead in abhorrent conditions. The evening entertainment was provided by Rooftop Express - an entertaining display of horsemanship with a trained bull and other animals. The rain paused just in time for the Ahrens Fireworks Extravaganza as our finale.

Rules and Conditions of Entry – All Rings

- a) **Completed Waivers and Horse Health Declarations must be provided.**
- b) **PIC numbers must be provided.**
- c) **Drug testing may be conducted any time before/during show**
- d) Safety helmets and regulation riding boots must be worn.
- e) Stewards reserve the right to disqualify contestants causing undue delay to the staging of an event.
- f) **Stallions** must be supervised. **See Stallion Safe Practices Guidelines.**
- g) Prize winners in registered events must present papers to stewards. Any competitor requiring confirmation of wins for Royal Point Score must complete relevant documentation with the judges and hand to the stewards.
- h) First prize winners only are eligible for championship judging. Champion ribbon will not be awarded where there is no competition.
- i) Ponies and Galloways cannot compete in horse classes.
- j) A brood mare exhibited in class for brood mares must be either in foal or have foal at foot and shall not be permitted to compete in saddle and harness classes.
- k) Stallions are not eligible for Hack classes.
- l) An exhibit which has won in a pairs or team class may still be considered a maiden or novice for a single class.
- m) Maiden classes are open to ponies or horses which have never won first prize at any show.
- n) All entries in harness classes must be harnessed to a regulation sulky and will not be judged if in a trotting gig.
- o) No electric fences or tape to be used.

Definitions:

An intermediate horse is one that has not won 1st, 2nd or 3rd place at any Royal Show.

Pony: 14 hands and under.

Galloway: Over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands.

Hack: Over 15 hands.

ne denotes "not exceeding".

>= denotes greater than or equal to.

Stallion Safe Practices Guidelines

These guidelines are consistent with Equestrian Australia's (EA) focus on improving safety by identifying risks and putting in place measures to mitigate those risks.

1. **Stallions must wear official 'discs' at all times whilst at the venue.** These discs are to be worn on both sides of head collars and bridles or on some part of the horse on both sides to identify to others that the horse is a stallion.
2. No stallion is to be moved around a venue without displaying the stallion discs and a suitable restraint. The restraint can be either a bridle, a rearing bit, or a chain lead rein over the nose or under the jaw.
3. Where possible all stallions are to be stabled. If suitable stabling is not available stallions need to wear a collar, which is securely tied to the outside of a truck or trailer. Stallions tied to the outside of a truck or trailer **MUST** be always supervised.
4. Stallions may be substituted in prize-giving ceremonies with another horse should the rider deem it to be safer.
5. It is recommended that riders and handlers of stallions at shows be over the age of 17 years; however, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to understand the full code of conduct for stallions at events. Except for rule 1.1.8 in the EA Show Horse Rules and Guidelines, stallions are not permitted in Show Horse classes at EA state or championship events. All riders/handlers under the age of 17 years must be supervised by an adult/parent/guardian whilst at the event.
6. It is the stallion owner's/rider's responsibility to ensure that all possible safety precautions are taken.
7. Floats/trucks that transport stallions should display the official magnet giving notice that there is a stallion on board.

The use of the horse and float identification discs is compulsory at all Equestrian Australia events. The horse and float discs are available for purchase from the National Office of Equestrian Australia. Only the approved discs will be permitted.

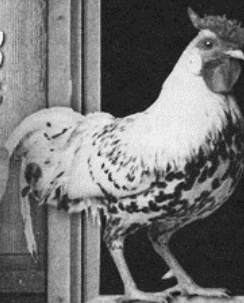

Rules and Conditions of Entry

- Completed Horse Health Declarations must be provided.**
- Completed Waivers and PIC numbers must be provided.**
- Drug testing may be carried out any time before/during show.**
- Children under 8 years are to be accompanied in the ring with an adult.
- Horses must be registered Miniature Horse, Small Horse, Little Horse, or pony.
- Proof of registration must be produced on demand of Show official.
- MHSA Inc. height for age rules apply - actual age.
- Weanlings must be 4 months of age or older.
- Halter classes - Yearlings and older, age is as of 1st August.
- Performance class age is actual age on day of show.
- Horses' feet may not be placed by hand.
- Colts & stallions must be handled by a competent adult 18 years & over.
- Pony heights same as corresponding horse heights in miniature and small pony classes only.

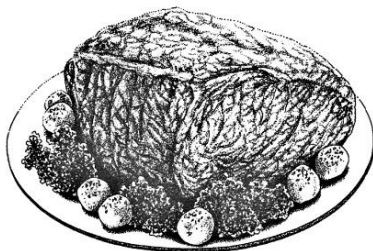

Rules and Regulations For Exhibitors

1. All entries received are subject to the Rules and By-Laws of Gilgandra Show Society Inc. (*The Society*)
2. All competitive exhibits must be the bona fide property of exhibitor except where otherwise stated on Schedule. Exhibitors of stock will be required to furnish all particulars as to age and pedigree of each exhibit; also breeder's name - where such is known - and such other information as the Committee may require or demand, and a declaration from each exhibitor of sheep must accompany their entries, stating how the sheep have been fed (either on natural grasses or artificially; if artificially, what food has been used, whether such sheep have been housed, and if so, for what period; the date of shearing and that the sheep have been honestly shorn, and whether by hand or machine; and that the particulars given in the entry are true and correct). The Committee reserves for themselves the right to disqualify any exhibits improperly entered, or regarding which any false statements have been made. If any doubts arise as the correctness of the declaration of any exhibitor, such exhibitor shall not be entitled to any prize which may be awarded to them until the Committee shall have satisfactory proof that the declaration is correct; and any exhibitor having made a false declaration shall be subject to any of the following penalties: Forfeiture of the prize, loss of right to exhibit in the future, and expulsion from the Show and/or Society.
3. Every care shall be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or death.
4. In a section where there is only one exhibit, half the prize only may be awarded; but if judges certify that the exhibit is of exceptional merit, they may award a prize. Judges may award second instead of first.
5. Any person interfering with the judges during the time they are adjudicating may be removed from the grounds.
6. Should any dispute arise as to the awarding of prizes the matter will be referred to the Committee, whose decision will be final.
7. **Protest, with \$20 deposit**, which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous, must be lodged in writing with the secretary within two hours after the award is made.
8. All exhibits must be on the ground before 9.30am and until 4:30pm each day of the Show, unless by special permission of the Stewards, under penalty of \$5.
9. Exhibitors will render themselves liable to a penalty of \$10 for removing or affixing any placard, ticket, or ribbon, except by instruction of the Stewards, who shall incur no responsibility by putting these regulations into force. All ribbons and tickets must be removed from exhibits while they are being judged.
10. Only ribbons and prize tickets won at the Show can be affixed to exhibits while on the Showground.
11. Proved willful misrepresentation of exhibit(s) will not merely forfeit the prize but render the exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at any future Show or Shows registered under the Royal Agricultural Association of New South Wales.
12. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any event or entry without giving reason for doing so.
13. The Committee reserves the right to change, add, combine, or delete any classes without notice.
14. Gilgandra Show Society **does not** accept any responsibility for any damage or injury caused by Stallions whilst in attendance at the Show.

Important Information for Exhibitors

Copies of all forms, including the General Waiver, are available from our website, applicable Chief Stewards, and the Show office.

ASC Individual Waivers must be completed by anyone at the Show who is:

- competing in horse events
- responsible for handling animals
- competing in physical activities such as Wood Chopping, Farmers Challenge, Lawn Mower Racing, etc.

All stock must comply with NSW legislation in relation to animal movement and stock identification.

The Gilgandra Showground PIC number is NJ225056.

Horse Exhibitors must complete all sections of the **ASC Individual Waiver** and the **ASC Horse Health Declaration**. Each horse with which the competitor is involved in competition at the Show must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show.

Cattle Exhibitors must complete all sections of the **ASC Individual Waiver**, a **National Cattle Health Declaration** and provide a **National Vendor Declaration**. In addition, Exhibitors must provide certification that animals entered for competition in all Cattle Classes, including calves at foot, have been tested for Pestivirus and certified as non-PI (Persistently Infected). Certification must be provided in the form of a laboratory report or signed veterinary certificate, listing animals and their identification. Animals previously tested and certified as non-PI are not required to be retested, however certification must be provided.

Sheep Exhibitors must complete all sections of the **ASC Individual Waiver**, a **National Sheep Health Statement**, and provide a **National Vendor Declaration**.

Poultry Exhibitors: A PIC number is required for any holding on which is held 100 or more chickens, turkeys, guinea fowl, ducks, geese, quail, pigeons (including racing pigeons), pheasant or partridge and 10 or more of emus and/or ostriches. The onus is on individual property and stock owners to comply with PIC requirements under Clause 29 of the Stock Diseases Act 2009. There is no active surveillance for, or compliance of, PICs for properties on which Poultry are held.

Some Tips for Competition Cooking

1. Cakes should be baked an even colour all round, risen evenly with no crust or peaks on top. Icing if stated, should only be on top with no decorations unless stated.
2. Remove any lining paper from cakes, line tins carefully without creases.
3. Fruit Cakes - all fruit to be cut the same size, particularly cherries, nuts (but not too finely), not over flavoured with spirits.
4. Sponges - the two layers should be the same depth (weigh tins), spread very thinly with raspberry jam, no sifted icing sugar on top. Definitely no rack marks. (A good rule for all cakes, turn out onto a tea towel)
5. Biscuits - must be crisp, dainty size, delicate golden colour. Generally, each variety same size. Use whole rolled oats.
6. Jams - set but not rubbery, fruit soft, jam clear, no mould. Presented in jars which are clearly labelled. Lids to be covered if commercial.
7. Ring tins are never used.
8. Muffins and cupcakes to be baked with papers in tins.
9. Slices – uniform size.

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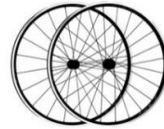

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Crops are judged on apparent yield, trueness to type and purity, freedom from disease, evenness and condition, freedom from weeds, and farming practices.

Local winner qualifies for entry in the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW (AgShows NSW) Suncorp Dryland Field Wheat Competition.

For the AgShows NSW competition, the State is divided into four regions, each of which comprises various Show Societies and NSW Farmers' Associations who organise local competitions. Gilgandra is included in the Northern Region, along with Baradine, Barraba, Bellata, Bingara, Boggabri, Bourke, Burren Junction, Coonamble, Crooble, Croppa Creek, Delungra, Garah, Gulargambone, Gurley, Inverell, Manilla, Moree, Mungindi, Narrabri, Narromine, North Star, Nyngan, Tottenham, Walgett, Wyallda, Warren, and Wee Waa.

The top five crops in each region are judged to determine the regional winners, from which the state winner is selected.

Gilgandra Show Society - A Brief History

In the early 1900's, there was considerable discussion amongst district landowners in regard to holding a Show, with many new settlers having arrived from Victoria, where the benefits of agricultural societies were fully recognised. At the time, the Farmers' and Settlers' Association was very well supported and held an annual Carnival.

A Pastoral and Agricultural (P & A) Association was established in Gilgandra on 25 March 1911 with the first general meeting chaired by Mr William Stockings.

The first committee meeting of the Gilgandra P & A Association was held at Tattersall's Hotel on Saturday 6th May 1911, at 4pm. Acting Secretary Arthur Fitzhardinge was voted to the chair, and announced the ballot for the election of officers and committee. This meeting also resolved to investigate the availability of suitable sites for a Show ground.

A report to the management meeting held on 11th September 1911 indicated that the Department of Lands had agreed to the allocation of a parcel of land adjoining the railway station. The committee agreed that a parcel of 40 acres should be applied for.

The first Gilgandra Show was held on Wednesday 15th May 1912 at the Racecourse, as the permanent Showground site had not yet been developed. The Show was officially opened by the then Minister for Agriculture, Mr. John Trefle. A crowd of over 2,500 attended, and entries numbered 800, far exceeding the expectations of the committee.

The first two-day Show was held on 7th and 8th May 1913, moving to an August Show in 1915. Gilgandra P & A Association joined the Royal Agricultural Society in October 1913.

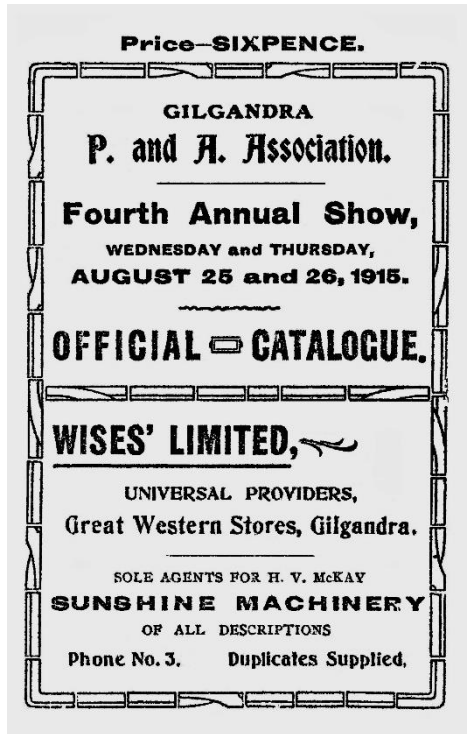
In 1918, the first Showground Trustees were appointed.

Gilgandra Show was abandoned for 1942 due to the Second World War, with one-day patriotic events held in 1943 and 1944 to aid the war effort. The two-day patriotic Show was held on 14 and 15 August 1945, with the second day coinciding with the announcement of the end of World War Two. The full two-day Show returned in 1946. In 1947, the Show date was changed from August to May.

In 1988, the Gilgandra P & A Association became Gilgandra Show Society Inc. following incorporation. Our 100th annual Show was held in 2015.

While the 2020 Show was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, two new amenities blocks were constructed during the year. New stables were added in 2021, the Showground perimeter fencing was renewed in 2022, and new cattle yards provided in 2024.

Gilgandra Show Society Inc. is proud to present the annual Show as a celebration of our local agricultural heritage and ongoing achievements.

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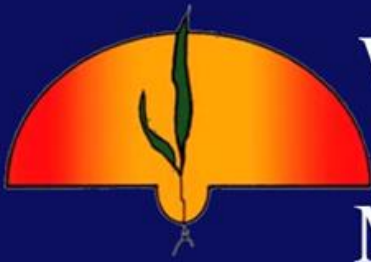
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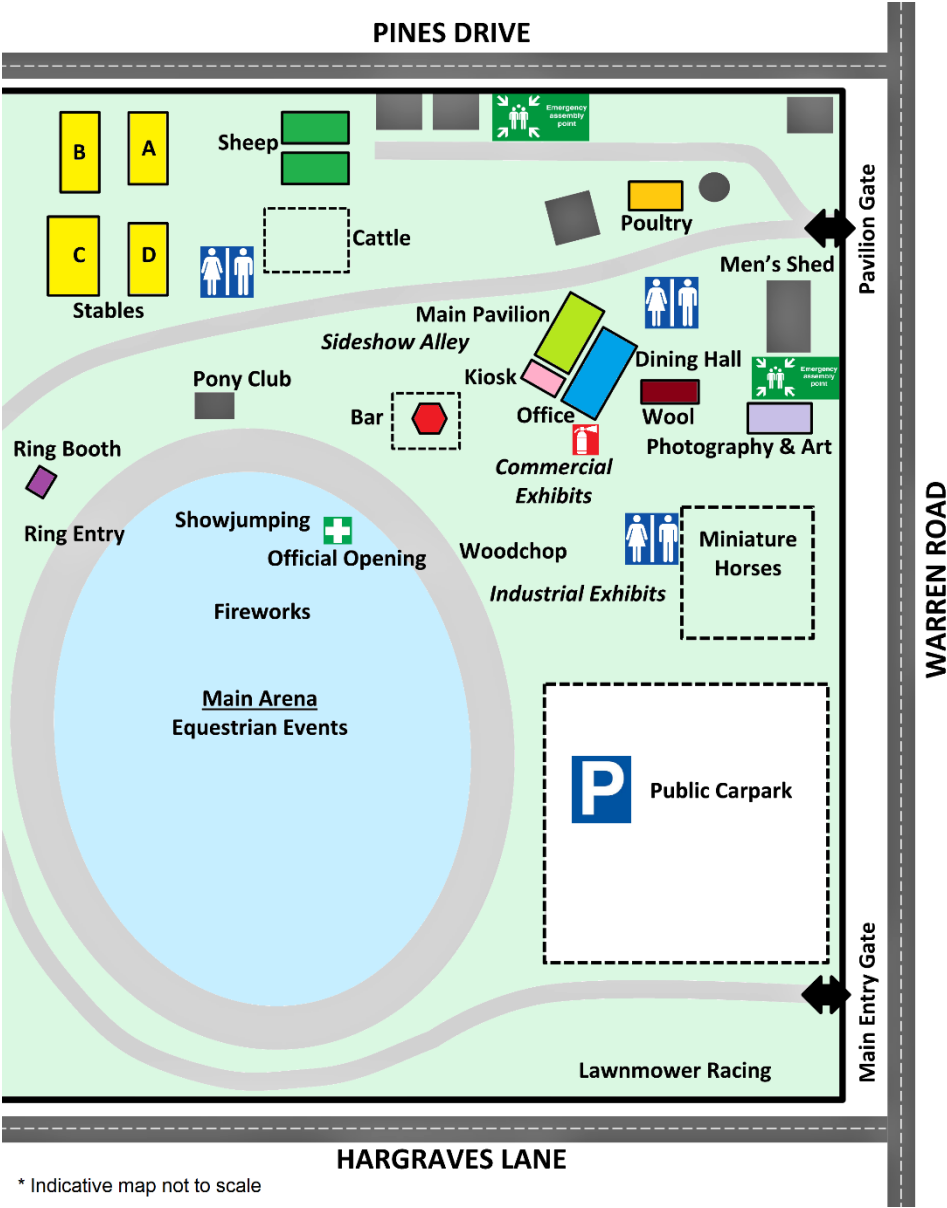
